Appendix A

Students' Union President's Report for the Students' Representative Council Meeting on the Day of January 17, 2025

Home Safe for the Holidays - Travel Bursary

• Before our team left for the Winter Break, we awarded our Members bursaries to help cover fuel expenses to make travelling home for the holidays possible. This project applied only to in-province students and aimed primarily at students from rural and reserve communities. For this project, I was responsible for sourcing funding from outside the Students' Union, coordinating the application process (along with other team members), and supporting the fund allocation process. This project was a great success, with no funds remaining from our Alumni Association donations.

Food Security Education Project

• This project provides students with open-access and no-cost education from grassroots activists and academic researchers on how to help create a more food-secure community, delivering practical information to combat this pressing issue in Halifax. Along with research-focused education in food security, this project offers one (1) paid assistantship in food security research to one (1) MSVU student who partakes in this project. The seminar series was launched on the 14 of January; today (the 17 of January) marks the completion of our third lecture. As this project's manager, I have accomplished the following: I constructed a project plan, secured a Department of Nutrition research director for the assistantship portion of the project, wrote an accepted proposal (in the amount of 5,655 CAD) to the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS), secured five (5) community lecturers, and organized payments to those lecturers. This was all done with support from other Councillors. Now, I am working closely with our Administrative Assistant & Governance Secretary (AAGS) to create an account from which the research director can pay his summer assistant.

Standards of Excellence Grant

• To better align our food bank with the national standards, our team was approved for CAD 14,187 to procure a consultant (September 2024). Union staff and elects (myself, included) helped onboard our new Food Security Policy Analyst in December. As we approached the holidays, I met with our Analyst to explain her first work product: a jurisdiction scan. When the Union re-opened, I provided edits to her first j-scan draft. The final version was submitted today, including recommendations from the Food Bank Manager. Now, I am working closely with the AAGS and CFO to release payment, and looking forward to supporting our Analyst on her next product.

Community Project Fund

In the fall, I met with the MSVU President to present the idea of a community
project fund that would allow our members to bring their innovative ideas to life.
This week, I received confirmation that the project is close to launching and
have begun working to confirm four (4) Councillors to serve on the awarding
committee.

Dalhousie Legal Aid Tenant's Rights Clinic

 This project aimed to inform students about their rights as renters in Nova Scotia, providing them with 1:1 sessions with Dalhousie Legal Aid. This event was held on the 13 of January in the Students' Union Board Room. For this project, I was solely responsible for all our Students' Union's responsibilities.

Newsletter (2.0) Launch

 Our communications and student life staff and elects are in the early planning stages of the launch of our newsletter. Team members working on this project have committed themselves to a mid-February timeline to publish our newsletter and host a launch party in the Rook. For this project, I have involved myself in coordinating deadlines so that our Council and project implementers are clear on our expectations as a team.

Students for the Liberation of Palestine Kjipuktuk (SLPK) - Working Together

 As a continuation of our discussions with SLPK, I met two (2) team members in December and again in January. These discussions aimed to support the steps to follow the financial disclosure motion presented to MSVU's Senate in the fall.

MSVUSU Naloxone Program

 The MSVUSU naloxone program provides students with no-cost, unfettered, and confidential access to naloxone. This project was formed in partnership with the NS Take Home Naloxone program (2024). Currently, I am working with the Indigenous Student Advisor to produce indicators for the doors of all satellite sites to make sites more visible.

VP Student Life Report: January 17th

Since starting the second semester and 2025, I have started the semester off with Winter Orientation. To start, we partnered with Residence Life to host a winter carnival on January 6th in the MPR which had great turn out. This is the report of the Vice President Research and Graduate Student Affairs, MSVUSU

Service Reports:

- **Food Bank:** Operating on Tuesdays and Fridays during winter 2025, the Food Bank Manager has exciting projects planned for February, with further details to be announced soon.
- Captain Crow's Café: Provides meals on Mondays and snacks on Thursdays. The latest service delivered approximately 40 meals to students and 30–35 snacks on Thursdays.
- **Bi-weekly Check-ins:** I hold regular check-ins with the food security service managers to ensure the smooth operation of services.

Orientation:

• For the winter orientation, I assisted in organizing events for graduate students, including the Graduate Student Social and the Knowledge Fair, scheduled for January 20th and 28th, respectively.

February Plans:

- 1. **AI Workshop:** During the first week of February, I have planned for Emily Ballantyne to join our workshop on AI, guiding students on referencing, citing, and using AI effectively. She will also provide support in understanding its appropriate applications.
- 2. **Roundtable Discussion (Tentative February 6th):** I am coordinating a discussion on the sustainable allocation of food security funds. The event will include experts from non-profits, finance, food security initiatives, university finance professors, and university advancement to develop effective strategies for financial education and sustainability within our food security services.
- 3. **Collaborative Event:** In mid-February, I'm helping organize an event with the VP Student Life, International Student Representative, Pride Centre Manager, and Soup Kitchen Manager. This event will focus on student engagement opportunities, including election and hiring positions within the student union and external organizations. The event will also feature Valentine's care packages and themed desserts from Captain Crow's Café.

Ongoing Contributions:

- Facilitating a meeting with the Graduate Student Committee to address student concerns and brainstorm strategies to enhance their support system.
- Supporting the AHN department by organizing events and addressing graduate student concerns.
- Assisting the Food Security Policy Analyst as needed.
